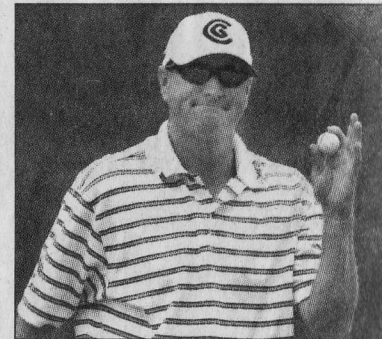

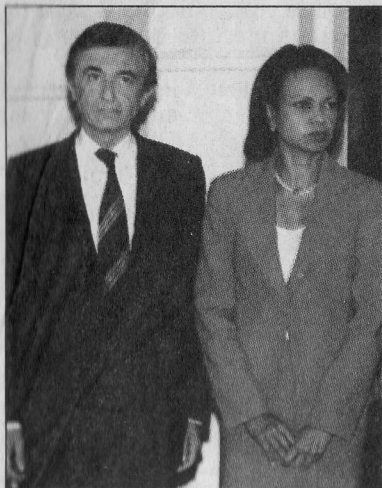

SUSPECT ADMITS HIS GUILT

## Print fingers Bosley burglar

In the midst of trashing and burglarizing the home of Amy and Bob Bosley a few days after Bosley was killed there last summer, the two thieves stopped for a bite to eat.

They heated up a frozen Tombstone pizza and grabbed a couple of bottles of iced tea from the re-

frigerator. But it was the condiments they used for their toppings that lead to their downfall.

On the outside of a half-empty jar of Hormel's Real Bacon on the kitchen table, Campbell County police detectives found a single fingerprint. They traced that print to Rodney Weinel, a middle-aged man with a string of burglary and theft convictions.

On Thursday, after hearing two

days of evidence tying him to the crime, the 39-year-old Weinel gave up his claim of innocence. Without so much as a hint of a deal from prosecutors, Weinel pleaded guilty in Campbell Circuit Court to charges of theft, burglary and being a persistent felony offender.

"My reaction was we convinced
